A lack of consistent access to enough food for every person in a household to live an active, healthy life









Food Security is a "wicked problem"

GROWING FOOD & NUTRITION SECURITY



Authoritative Strategies

- Pro: decreases the complexity of the problem solving
 - process
- Con: experts/authorities can
 be wrong



• Competitive Strategies

- Pro: opponents spur on progress
- Con: confrontation could
 create and lead to acceptance
 of bad solutions



Collaborative Strategies Pro: members share costs, benefits and bring variety of experiences to the table Con: potential time spent to arrive at solution

This model is created to advance the cooperation between food system partners as identified in (9) key elements. These key elements were selected based upon EBP Integrative Care Models.


